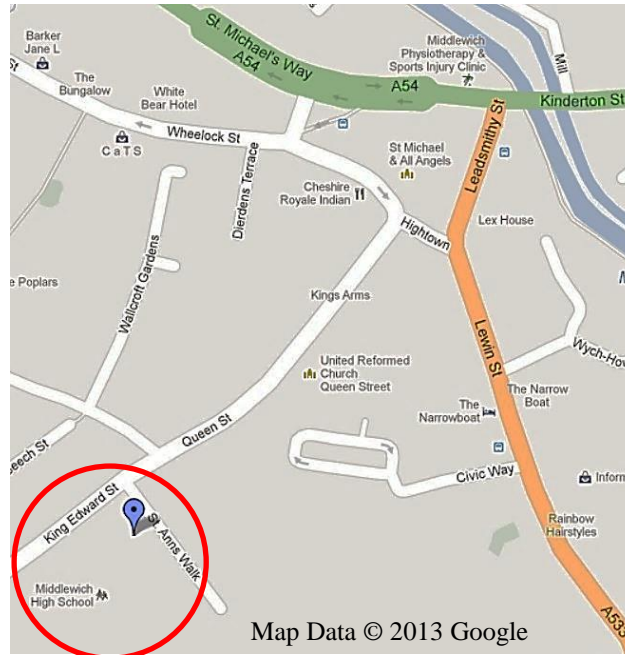

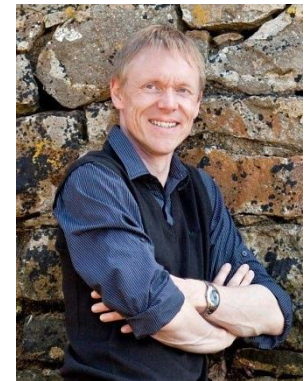
Before They Become Famous XII
